

Entry Procedure for Advanced Math

Students exiting 5th grade and those already in middle school can qualify for the advanced math program in several ways. They include:

- 5th grade students who have qualifying scores from a series of NWEA and other test results (e.g. MEAP) classroom performance (e.g. report card marks, homework completion), and any additional data that is available.
- Current 6th and 7th grade students who demonstrate a need for additional consideration as a result of their NWEA and other tests, classroom performance, and any additional data that is available. Parents whose students qualify are then notified of the committee's decision through a letter mailed home. Students who accept will be admitted into the program in the **fall of 2011**, as space allows.
- Parents of 6th grade students who feel their child demonstrates a need for additional challenge or rigor have an opportunity to have their child considered for advanced 7th grade math by submitting the *Advanced Math Parent Form* by Thursday, **February 15, 2011**. The form should be sent to the Office of Instruction, Advanced Programming. (See contact information below.)
- New 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students who enroll in Northville Public Schools and have been in an advanced math program in the prior district. (Note: Parents need to submit verification of prior enrollment in a gifted program to the school counselor when registering.)

New 6th and 7th grade students who enroll late in the school year and meet the qualifying scores through summer testing. Parents should include any other available data (e.g. report card grades, state testing) Parents need to contact the Office of Instruction for the *Advanced Math Parent Form* and return it by Tuesday, **June 14, 2011** for summer testing. Students will be tested **June 20 or 21, 2011** (tentative). Parents will be notified by letter of the committee's decision by mid-August.
