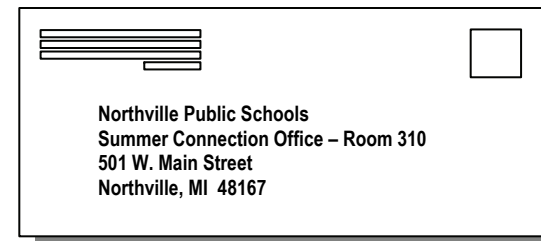

2. **You may register by mail.** Please forward registration form and tuition to:



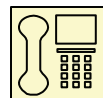
3. **You may register online and pay by credit card using the Pay-Schools™ system**

**Purpose of the Elementary Summer Connections Program:**

To give Northville elementary students the opportunity to continue making connections to the Reading, Writing, and Investigation/ Problem-Solving Skills that were acquired during the regular school year.

The recommended situation would be for Elementary students to attend the entire summer session to increase their learning time. This may not be a realistic option for many families because of vacations, camps and other conflicts. Therefore, students may participate in the first session, the second session or they may attend both sessions.

**For students who have completed Kindergarten**

**\*\*\*\* FIRST GRADE DEVELOPMENT**

**8:15 -10:15    OR    10:20 -12:20**  
**(Two timeslots to choose from)**

Designed for students entering first grade who wish to continue to build reading/writing readiness and numeracy skills. The class will focus on hands-on individual and small group activities to enhance the students' current skill level.

**For students who have completed 1st and/or 2nd grades**

**\*\*\*\* READING AND WRITING WORKSHOP I**

**8:15 – 10:15**

**(Foundations in Language Arts)**

This class will use Reading and Writing exploration to build and strengthen individual skill areas. The class will focus on the “6 + 1 Writing Traits” to develop written communication skills. Thematic Units will help students enhance reading comprehension and connect with literature. ELL students are welcome!

**\*\*\*\* INVESTIGATIONS INTO MATH AND SCIENCE I**

**10:20 – 12:20**

Students participate in hands-on Math and Science activities to reinforce and strengthen problem-solving, computation and numeracy skills.

Students participate in hands-on Math and Science activities to reinforce and strengthen problem-solving, computation and numeracy skills.

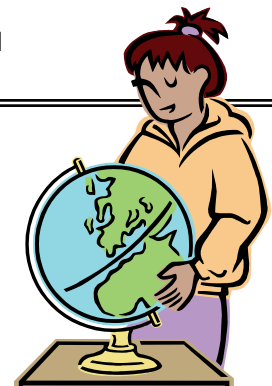
**\*\*\*\* READING AND WRITING WORKSHOP II**

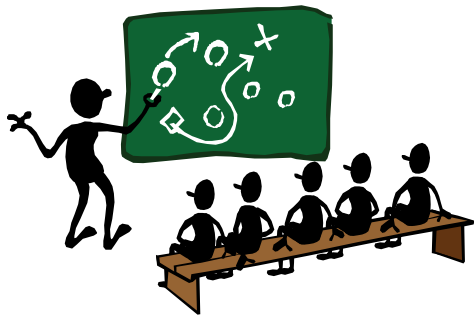
