Students are primarily assigned to Hillside Middle School based on residency; however, Northville Public Schools has an open enrollment process available for district residents who would like to attend a school within the District that is not in their attendance area. Hillside Middle School's enrollment for the 2009-10 school year was 847 students. Hillside's staff includes Principal Jim Cracraft, Assistant Principal Heidi Capraro, 31 general education teachers, 15 elective teachers, a media Para-educator and two guidance counselors. Hillside also is served by three special education teachers, two learning consultants, one academic resource teacher, a school psychologist, a school social worker, an ESL (English as a second language) teacher, a speech and language teacher, and support staff for students with special needs. Approximately 95 percent of Hillside parents participated in parent-teacher conferences last year.

Hillside staff and students have been recognized at the state and national level for excellence in teaching and student achievement. Points of pride at Hillside include the annual Senior Citizens Prom, the Fine Arts Extravaganza, Challenge Day, the Animal Room Docent Program, the Frog Nursery, Building Bridges with Old Village School, Operation Good Cheer, Kids Against Hunger, and Spirit Days for Civic Concern. Hillside families support students and staff through a strong and active PTSA.

For 2009-2010, Hillside made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English language arts and mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve.

### ***School Improvement Goals for 2010-2011***

1. Improve overall student achievement. All students will demonstrate success in the core academic subjects by demonstrating proficiency on local and state assessments. Target Area: Math
2. All students will be encouraged to become more aware of life-long wellness choices and opportunities.
3. Sustain a learning community which promotes a positive learning environment where respect and caring for others is fashionable.

The school's curriculum is aligned with the Michigan Department of Education Grade Level Content Standards and Michigan Merit Curriculum, as appropriate. Each subject area committee analyzes the curriculum to ensure that it is aligned with state grade level expectations.
